Shared Intelligence Bolsters National Defense



of **cyber decision-makers** see public-private partnerships as a force multiplier in cyber resilience

100% of public sector and 96% of private sector leaders report benefiting from shared cybersecurity intelligence, including:



Educating staff on a threat **(50%)**



Proactively responding to a threat (47%)



Fine-tuning overall cybersecurity posture (45%)



Organizations (ISAOs)/Information Sharing and Analysis Centers (ISACs)

Lack of trust in intelligence from outside sources (36%)


Lack of training within the IT department (36%) Lack of specific information sharing requirements (35%)
